"Where is my magic hen?" asked the king. "I told you to bring her back." "I did bring her back," said the magician. "I put her in the cage but I


just didn't have time to change her from a rabbit back into a hen."

Blue Mountain Skiing

Watching huge chunks of ice shift and crash into one another in Georgian Bay made me think of the Arctic. Not surprising really because the North Pole is a scant 3,000 miles north of the charming little town of Thornbury in Ontario where we stayed.

I hadn't planned a trip to Canada this month but when I

asked my granddaughter what she wanted for her birthday on 16th March, she said: "You, granny!" It was too precious a gift to deny us both, especially as we could celebrate her sister's birthday too.

Our days were spent at Georgian Peaks, a ski resort in the Blue Mountains where the family skied, including the two year old! It was lovely to see whole families enjoying March Break together out on the slopes – and to watch our son and his daughter racing one another down what seemed to me very steep runs. Watching them made me wish I had started skiing at a younger age – and had kept at it.



There were some freezing days but not too shocking because, strangely, Thornbury and Tenbury Wells are not that far apart in latitude. The difference is in humidity; it's easier to keep warm in Canada!

I enjoyed exploring Thornbury which is a very pretty little town on a large bay of Lake Huron. It has some

charming independent shops and boutiques and a fabulous bakery and café where everything is cooked to order – freshly baked bread, croissants, pies, cakes, buns. Perfect snacks to take to the lake shore.

I was fascinated by the marina which looked almost ghostly, the deserted moorings discernible in ice formations, the boats all safely tucked away nearby. It was here when temperatures rose that melting ice got tossed and jostled in the wind and formed dangerous ice ledges and floating icebergs.

Simnel cake – the perfect Easter treat

Ingredients

250g mixed dried fruit (a mixture of sultanas, currants, raisins and candied mixed peel)
1 orange, zested and juiced
500g pack marzipan
250g butter, softened
200g light brown soft sugar
4 eggs plus 1 beaten to glaze
175g plain flour
100g ground almonds
1 tsp baking powder
1 lemon, zested
2 tsp mixed spice
1 tsp vanilla extract

Method

100g glacé cherries, halved

3 tbsp apricot jam

Put the mixed dried fruit in a bowl with the orange juice and zest and 2 tbsp water. Cover and microwave for 2 mins, then leave to cool completely.

Heat oven to 150C/130C fan/gas 2. Roll out a third of the marzipan and use the base of a deep 20cm cake tin as a template to cut out a circle. Wrap any offcuts and the remaining two-thirds of marzipan and set aside for later. Butter and line the cake tin with a double layer of parchment. Beat the butter and sugar together until creamy. Add the eggs, flour, almonds, baking powder, lemon zest, mixed spice and vanilla (all in one go) and mix until well combined. Mix in the cooled soaked dried fruit and fold in the cherries.

Scrape half the cake mixture into the tin. Top with the disc of marzipan, then the remaining cake mixture, and level the top with a spatula. Bake for 2 hours. Check it's cooked by inserting a skewer to the centre of the cake, if any wet mixture clings to the skewer, return to the oven for another 10 mins, then check again. Cool in the tin for 15 mins, then

turn out onto a wire rack and leave to cool completely.

Brush the top of the cake with apricot jam. Roll out half of the remaining marzipan and use the base of the cake as a template to cut out another disc. Place it on top of the cake and crimp the edges. Roll the remaining marzipan into 11 equal-sized balls for the 11 apostles (excluding Judas). Brush the marzipan with beaten egg and arrange the apostles in a circle around the outside. Brush them with a little egg too. Put under a hot grill for a minute or two until just starting to caramelise – be very careful as the marzipan will burn easily. Leave to cool and wrap a ribbon around the cake.

We let our holiday caravans at Wigley Orchard in Stoke Bliss through our agent, Hoseasons, and Hoseasons let through Booking.com. So we visited the Booking.com website to see what it had to say about us.

To begin with Wigley Orchard is quite hard to find. It's no good searching for properties in Worcestershire, Bromyard, Tenbury Wells ... according to Booking.com we are a resort village in Clifton upon Teme.

The local attractions listed are interesting. First is Margery Thorn Farm in Harpley, which is a listed farmhouse and barn but also a private house. In Bromyard you'll find The Time Machine Museum of Science Fiction, as well as The Knapp, a children's playground which has a dog exclusion order and is in the restricted alcohol zone. Local restaurants include Pensons in Stoke Bliss which closed some time ago and was replaced by Native, now also closed.

The nearest airport is Gloucester, 42 miles away so just a bit nearer than Birmingham but a hub for private charter flights with no scheduled flights since 2017. Citywing used to be based there and flew to the Isle of Man.

Facilities at Wigley Orchard apparently include a tennis court. We did consider building a tennis court about 20 years ago but decided against it. The area where it would have been is now a pond. Interestingly the languages spoken on site include Danish, Croatian, Norwegian and Polish as well as French, German, Spanish and English. I don't think English is a problem, the others may be a stretch too far.

Check-in time at Wigley Orchard is given as 4pm to 11.59pm. In fact we encourage visitors to arrive at 4 o'clock and are not very pleased if we have to wait until after 8 o'clock to welcome our guests.

Are dogs welcome at Wigley Orchard? Yes, in some caravans, but not at all according to Booking.com. However we apparently have a caravan which will accommodate four adults and up to three children, although our largest unit is for just four people.

I had to put in the dates I required to access the site and unfortunately there was no accommodation available at Wigley Orchard for those dates. But the site was happy to recommend similar properties which I might consider – at Ribblesdale, Filey, Scarborough and Aberdeen.

So we're looking forward to welcoming a family of seven from Croatia who are keen to play tennis and are disappointed to find that Clifton on Teme is not by the seaside. Happy days!

Teme Valley Wildlife

If you go down to the woods today ... you might find a woodcock, as I very possibly did a few weeks ago when I entered my nearest patch of woodland to see whether the hazel catkins were out. They weren't, but a largish bird flew up from the dried leaves of the woodland floor some ten feet in front of me, then zig-zagged

silently between the trees and away out of sight. The lack of a squawk, an accurate flightpath and middling size suggested that this had not been a pheasant, although I was left with an impression of colourful feathers. Sadly, I did not catch a glimpse of a head or beak so cannot be certain exactly what it was.

My local wood offers many features capable of attracting an unusual bird such as a woodcock. It is deciduous, has open rides, deep dry leaf-litter and plenty of wet areas where small springs seep out to a nearby brook. The woodcock is technically a wader, having a long arched bill, but has adapted to life amongst trees rather than on the

shoreline where its relatives the curlew and sandpiper are more likely to be found. It uses its long bill for dabbling in soft mud to retrieve worms, small insects and molluscs and feeds largely in the early evening, resting up during the day in drier parts of the wood. It has large eyes for seeing in low light conditions and these are unnatu-

rally placed high up on the sides of its head, providing a very wide arc of vision.

Woodcock reach about the size of a wood pigeon and have mottled russet feathers, a perfect camouflage for sitting amongst dried leaves. Two populations live in Britain, a native one present all year round and a migrant population flying in across the North Sea in September to escape the frozen winter ground of northern climes. The latter departs in March. Resident birds nest on the ground between March and June, producing four mottled eggs. Both parents care for the chicks and are reputed to carry them between their legs to

protect them in times of danger. In summer, male birds exhibit a slow territorial flight at dusk and dawn. Slow wingbeats and a triple croak followed by a whistled "tsiwick" cry characterise this unusual behaviour, which is known as "roding".

For centuries the woodcock has been a game bird. Shakespeare wrote of dusk as "cock-shutt time", a time when men set up cockshuts, which were nets suspended vertically between two poles to catch birds for the table. Some places recall this activity in present-day names such as Cockshutt Wood, but the name is derived from the much more ancient Anglo-Saxon phrase, "Cocc sciete".

One final woodcock curiosity is that an old Worcestershire apple was named after it. Used for eating and cider-making, this large, oblong, red-

streaked apple was held on a long stalk thought to resemble a woodcock's beak. I wonder, does anyone still grow it?
