Dear Readers

Be still, and know that I am God. (Psalm 46:10)

Lent often arrives quietly, slipping into the calendar without the fanfare of Christmas or the excitement of Easter. And yet it carries a depth that is both challenging and refreshing – a time to pause, to reflect and to begin again. It is a season of preparation, not unlike the careful planning that comes before a journey.

This year, as Lent approaches, I find myself preparing for my first caravanning trip of the year. The checklist grows daily – checking the tyres, ensuring the water system is working, stocking up on provisions. Each task is necessary to ensure a smooth journey, and it strikes me that Lent is not so different. It, too, is a time of preparation—a spiritual journey where we make space for renewal, casting aside what clutters our minds and hearts and making room for something fresh.

It can be tempting to think of Lent as simply a time to give something up – chocolate, coffee, social media. But what if we saw it instead as a time to take something on? Just as the land begins to stir after winter, preparing for the new life of spring, so too can we use this time to refresh our spirits. Renewal is not always about dramatic changes; sometimes, it is in the quiet and steady routines where we find the deepest transformation.

A season of reflection

Lent encourages us to step back and look at the bigger picture. Just as farmers allow the land to rest before planting anew, we, too, can take a pause. In our world of constant noise and busyness, where every minute seems accounted for, when do we truly stop? The psalmist's words remind us to "be still" – not just physically, but in mind and spirit. It is in these still moments that we find clarity, that we hear the quiet whisper of God's presence, reminding us that we do not walk alone.

Perhaps this season is an opportunity to create

those moments intentionally. It could be as simple as taking a walk without distractions, sitting in silence for a few minutes each day, or making space for prayer and reflection. Not as another item on a to-do list, but as a gift to ourselves – a reminder that we are more than our responsibilities.

The journey of renewal

Much like a journey, Lent is not about racing to a destination but about what we learn along the way. It is about recalibrating our hearts. The world encourages us to strive—to do more, be more, achieve more. Yet Jesus calls us to something different. "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28)

Rest does not mean stopping everything but finding balance—learning to carry life's responsibilities with a lighter heart. During Lent, we can ask ourselves: What am I carrying that I do not need? Maybe it's anxiety, frustration or the endless pursuit of perfection. Perhaps it's the fear of uncertainty or the weight of past regrets. Just as I carefully decide what to pack for my caravanning trip, ensuring I take what is needed and leave behind what will only take up space, we, too, can choose what to carry spiritually.

Carrying light into the world

One of the beautiful aspects of Lent is that it doesn't just call us inward but also outward. Reflection should lead to action, not in grand gestures but in small, meaningful ways. A kind word, a moment

of patience, a phone call to someone who might need encouragement. Galatians 6:2 reminds us: "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ."

We are not called to go through life alone, just as we are not meant to journey through Lent in isolation. Walking alongside others – sharing burdens, listening, offering support – this is where renewal happens in its fullest sense. We are reminded that God's light is not something distant but something that shines through us when we choose to love and serve those around us.


Looking forward

As we prepare for the weeks ahead, let this Lent be more than just a season of self-denial. Let it be a journey – a journey of renewal, of pausing to see the beauty in simplicity, of making space for God's voice, of walking with kindness and light. And as the days lengthen and the first signs of spring appear, may we be reminded that renewal is not just for the world around us but for our own hearts as well.

At the heart of all this is hope – the hope that we are being shaped and prepared, not just for the end of Lent but for something greater. Just as the land, after its time of rest, brings forth new life, so too does God's love work within us, bringing renewal, restoration, and peace.

May this Lent be a time of gentle renewal for us all.




Snapshots from New Zealand

Just back from a month's holiday in New Zealand, what are the moments that stand out?

Sitting in the sunshine and eating Clevedon Coast oysters with curly fries. We started our trip here, just south of Auckland. After a few days to recover from the long journey we flew to Christchurch, hired a car and drove to Dunedin.

In Dunedin we visited St Paul's Cathedral. Built in the early 1900s to replace an earlier building, with soaring pillars of pale Oamaru sandstone and a huge vaulted ceiling, it was left unfinished for 50 years. The chancel was completed in 1971 and is semi-circular in a contrasting modern style. Behind the pulpit steps are three inset stones, one from Canterbury in Kent, one from Iona and one from St Paul's Cathedral in London.



We spoke to Mother Barbara, one of the ministry team, who was keen to tell us that the first woman to become a diocesan bishop was consecrated and enthroned in St Paul's in 1989.

Heading north again via Wanaka we arrived in Geraldine where we went to the cinema. The front rows of seats had been replaced by old comfy sofas and armchairs. As the lights went down and before the film could begin, the screen was filled with a huge Union Jack complete with a picture of the King and a stirring rendition of *God Save the King* was played.

On the way back to North Island we stayed near Blenheim in a beachfront apartment and got up at 6 o'clock in the morning to see the sun rise over the sea just outside our window.

Over the Cook Strait to Wellington. We visited Zealandia, a nature reserve where we saw tuatara. These reptiles look like little dinosaurs but are in fact the last survivors of an order that flourished 200 million years ago. They live for 60 years on average but can reach 100 years old.



Then on to Napier, rebuilt after the 1931 earthquake in the Art Deco style. It's set in the renowned wine producing area of Hawke's Bay, so we went to the Mission winery for a superb lunch. An iconic landmark, this is New Zealand's oldest winery established in 1851 by French missionaries.



Back in Clevedon, our last treat was a ferry ride from Pine Harbour to downtown Auckland – racing over the sparkling blue sea under a deep blue sky, it's always been one of our favourite things to do when we visit New Zealand.

And so, after a 43 hour journey door to door, here we are back in the rain with only our memories of a fabulous month on the other side of the world.



What's Lent about?

Lent may originally have followed Epiphany, just as Jesus' sojourn in the wilderness followed immediately on from his baptism, but it soon became firmly attached to Easter. It became the principal occasion for baptism and for the reconciliation of those who had been excluded from the Church's fellowship for whatever reason. This history explains the characteristic notes of Lent – self-examination, penitence, self-denial, study and preparation for Easter.

After Jo died in her late 90s, Ernest was staying with us when he put his hand in his pocket, produced his wallet and there, tucked away, wafer thin and faded, was Jo's lace hanky. "I have carried it close to my heart since that summer in 1928 when we met" he said.

When he died, I wanted to frame the hanky with this wonderful photograph of them in Paignton but I was overruled and, even in death, it remained close to his heart. There could be no more ro-

mantic tale in favour of the return of the humble hanky.

Teme Valley Wildlife

2025 seems to have delivered more dark and gloomy days than usual with lots of grey skies, mist and fog. Rain and flooded roads have kept me at home, so I've used the time to think up a few ideas for excursions to make when the rain stops and the sun comes out. Last year I had a little list on which was a visit

for centuries.



A trip to Gloucestershire is on my list again this year because I've recently read an article about Pasque flowers at a site of special scientific interest near Cirencester. I have never come across these plants in the wild, although they are sometimes planted in gardens, so to see their purple bellflowers or silky seedheads would really be something special. Although you hope to find



what you are looking for on such occasions, it's always a bit "hit and miss". You have to accept that the plants might no longer be there or that they're not in flower on the day you visit. I've planned a couple of other wildlife walks too, in the hope of seeing otters or hares, using a Shropshire

Hills area of outstanding natural beauty walks leaflet called "Walking with Offa".

I'm also hoping to visit Caynham church and camp, the latter being the only hill fort in the area that I haven't yet seen. Gardens are another priority. Last year, a trip to the National Trust's Weir Garden in Herefordshire was on my list, it is said to be best in spring but constant rain kept me away. A sunny, blue-skied day in May was a great success though, when I ticked off Hergest Croft Gardens near Kington. This is a garden whose footpaths I've tramped on a couple of occasions and whose gates I've passed many times, always with the comment, "must come back for a visit". And I can heartily recommend it. A fabulous ar-
