Special Days in May





Welcome to our new curate



Our new curate, Tobias Thornes, will be ordained in Worcester Cathedral on 29th June and will join us immediately after his ordination. His training incumbent will be Rev'd David Morris but he will be working across the Muddy Boots Mission Area and will be spending time in both Rev'd Sallie Butcher's area and

Rev'd Julia Curtis's area. Here is what Tobias has to say about himself.

"I come to you as a curate fresh out of theological college, having trained for three years at St Stephen's House in Oxford. I was born in Worcester and grew up in the countryside near Droitwich, in the parish of Hadzor with Oddingley. I've always had a passion for the environment, and have never been able to leave Worcestershire for very long – it's definitely the place that feels like home!

"I am thirty-two years old. Before training for the priesthood I was a physicist, studying physics and astronomy at University College, Durham, then taking a doctorate at Oriel College, Oxford, on the topic of weather and climate forecasting. Whilst there I was a member of our University Challenge team (we didn't get very far!) and served as a Bible clerk in the college chapel. I was also a physics teacher for a couple of years. I enjoy walking with my collie, horse-riding and writing about faith, science and the natural world, and try as far as possible to live life in harmony with nature. I'm looking forward to meeting all of you and getting involved with rural ministry in such a beautiful part of our county."

Hanley Dingle expanded thanks to generous donors

Staff and volunteers at Worcestershire Wildlife Trust are celebrating after raising £470,000 to buy 16 hectares of land next to their Hanley Dingle nature reserve.

Hanley Dingle, one of the oldest deciduous woodland areas in the country, rich in mosses and ferns, is a truly special place. The bluebells,

primroses, violets and wood anemone are all out in flower and it looks fabulous in the spring sunshine

Situated in a ravine, it is very difficult to access or manage which has resulted in a true haven for wildlife with very little disturbance from people. It is reminiscent of a rainforest and is designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest.

The land next to the Dingle will allow the plants and animals to extend their range, buffering them from the effects of climate change and helping to protect the site into the future. The Trust will plant trees, create ponds and allow natural regeneration to take hold – a long-term project to allow wildlife to thrive well into the future.

Mike Perry, Chief Executive Officer of the Trust,



explained "We would like to thank more than a thousand generous individuals, private trusts and businesses that have donated to our fund raising appeal.

"We'd also like to thank our supporters who are sadly no longer with us but whose gifts in their wills have enabled us to buy this im-

portant piece of land."

The Trust plans to create a mosaic of new habitats on the 16 hectares connecting Hanley Dingle to the Shortwood Brook. As well as creating meadows and glades, it will plant large- and small-leaved lime, oak, field maple and wild service trees in order to extend the woodland.

Ponds will be created in naturally wetter areas. The diverse habitats will be essential for supporting a wide array of wildlife from butterflies and birds to amphibians and dragonflies.

There are public footpaths through the wood but access other than on these is by special permit only. please contact the Trust for more information.

Mandarin Ducks



This month's cover photograph by Andrew Holmes is of a beautiful mandarin duck on the River Teme near Eastham Bridge.

The mandarin duck was introduced from the Far East, where it can still be found in China, Japan, Korea and parts of Russia. It escaped, or was deliberately released, from captivity in the UK. Mandarin ducks are actually quite shy birds, often hiding beneath overhanging willows and usually only forming small flocks.

They nest in holes in trees, sometimes high up and a long way from the water. Shortly after the ducklings hatch, the female flies down and tries to coax the young to jump from the nest. Once they have left the tree and made their way back to water, the father will return to the family and help to protect the ducklings.



Lemon cheesecake



This softly set no-bake lemon cheesecake is super simple and gelatine free, so suitable for vegetarians. Ginger works well with lemon but you could the gingernut biscuits in the base for digestives or oaty biscuits instead. Serves 12

Ingredients

100g/3½oz butter, melted, plus extra for greasing 275g/9¾oz gingernut biscuits

625g/1lb 6oz full-fat cream cheese (or soft cheese) 140g/5oz icing sugar, sifted

3 lemons, zest and juice (about 80ml/23/4fl oz) 150ml/5fl oz double cream

75g/2¾oz lemon curd

Method

Grease and line a 22-23cm/8½-9in loose-bot-

tomed or springform cake tin with baking paper.

Blitz the biscuits to crumbs in a food processor. Tip the crumbs into a bowl with the melted butter and mix thoroughly until the crumbs are completely coated. Transfer to the prepared tin and use the bottom of a glass or jar to press down firmly into an even layer over the base. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour.

To make the filling, put the cream cheese, icing sugar and zest from 2 of the lemons in a large bowl, and beat with an electric whisk until smooth.

Reserving 2 teaspoons of lemon juice, add the rest of the rest of the juice to the cream cheese mixture. Pour in the cream and continue beating until the mixture is thick.

Spoon the filling into the tin and spread evenly over the biscuit base, smoothing the top with the back of a spatula or spoon. Chill overnight in the fridge to set.

To serve, remove the cheesecake from the tin, carefully peeling off the baking paper, and transfer to a serving plate. Place the lemon curd in a bowl and loosen with just enough of the remaining lemon juice to create a runny texture. Drizzle over the top of the cheesecake and decorate with the remaining zest.



Whatever happened to the Leominster Canal?

Until about 300 years ago goods were difficult and expensive to transport to market. Moving stuff by cart was slow and the unmade roads were worse than today's potholes (by a country mile)

This had been the case for centuries, until one day in about 1760 a man had a good idea. What

about building a canal to tow a floating vessel to carry goods to market?

That man was Francis Eggerton, 6th Earl and 3rd Duke of Bridgewater, who wanted to sell his coal into the growing market of Manchester. He needed to obtain an Act of Parliament and he gained support by promising the price of coal would reduce to 4p per cwt (112lbs or about 50 kilos).

His canal turned out to be a stunning commercial success and soon everyone was investing in canals and shovels were digging and building "cuts", tunnels and aqueducts.

A bit late to the game came a plan for a canal



18 miles long to go from Mamble to Leominster.

The Leominster Canal Act 1791 was obtained on 13th May 1791, which allowed the proprietors to raise £150,000, with another £40,000 if necessary. By 1794 the canal had reached Woofferton but it took a further two years to reach Leominster.

Plans to extend east to the River Severn and west to Kington were never realised.

By the 1840s railways and steam engines arrived and canals could not compete. Some commercial canals remained operational until the 1950s but most closed fairly quickly. The Hereford to Shrewsbury railway opened in 1853, so after that the Leominster canal was doomed. It closed just five years later in 1858.

The remains of the aqueduct over the Teme (pictured above) can be seen near Little Hereford and it was still intact until the British army destroyed the centre arch in an explosives exercise during the Second World War. What is left was protected by a Grade 2 listing in 2000.

Known as the bridge of a million bricks, the second largest structure on the canal is Rea Aqueduct over the River Rea at Marlbrook, near Mamble. In 2013, due water ingress after torrential rain in the early part of that year, a large part of the eastern side of the aqueduct collapsed into the river.

- The price of coal in Leominster fell from £1.50 to £0.75 per ton when the canal opened.
- The canal never made enough profit to pay a dividend
- Its 18 mile length contained three tunnels, two aqueducts and 16 locks
- Over 4,000 miles of canal were constructed in Britain in the 70 years from 1760.
- £150,000 in 1790 would equal over £5 million in 2025.
- With no mechanical diggers the Leominster Canal project was completed in five years. Take that, HS2!

Teme Valley Wildlife

The hills of Worcestershire have been recognised as a site of special landscape and geological interest. They lie on a demarcation line which divides our island into two distinct areas, upland and lowland. Here in the Teme valley we live in upland Britain, the Severn plain east of the Malverns belongs to lowland Britain. The Abberley and Malvern Hills Geopark is a designation recognising the importance of our local landscape and brings together people who work in geology, forestry, conservation

and education with the aim of influencing its protection and management.

The Geopark covers 1,250 square kilometres of Shropshire, Worcestershire, Herefordshire and Gloucestershire. It is a long thin area running between Bridgnorth and Gloucester and takes in the Abberley, Suckley, Malvern and May Hills. In our region, it stretches west to east from Newnham Bridge to Kidderminster. A good way to enjoy the park is to walk its Geopark Way, a long-distance footpath of 109 miles taking in its high points and



many fabulous views from the hills. Seven years ago, I signed up for a few days' walking with the Malvern Walking Festival and found myself walking my first miles on the path. I have to confess that it was quite a few years before I completed them all, as I only occasionally got round to tackling the next 10-mile stretch.

The weather back in 2018 was hot and sunny when the walk started at the beginning of June. Following the Festival guide, we rambled along the

western foothills of the Malvern Hills and in one area passed through grassland dotted with hundreds of dried seedpods which pointed up to the sky. They were just beginning to burst open and shed their seeds, but the nature of their leaves and flowers had long since shrivelled away. I popped an unopened pod into my pocket and then into a brown paper bag when I got home. When it opened, I counted 30 black seeds, each a few millimetres in length, and wondered if they could be

daffodil seeds.

How long does it take for a daffodil seed to grow into a flowering plant? In my inexpert hands, seven years. I planted my mystery seeds in a pot and left it behind the greenhouse. Spring 2019 saw over twenty tiny thin leaves push through the soil, a good germination rate I thought. Since then, I have done nothing other than add a little water when the pot looked dry. This year's excessive rainfall caused me to forget all about watering anything anywhere and it wasn't until the garden daffodils were in full bloom that I suddenly remembered I hadn't paid any attention to my seed experiment. To my joy and delight a single bud was forming on one of the still-diminutive plants. Even more joy, it wasn't eaten by Mitzi muntjac or by a slimy slug or snail. But, joy of joys, it opened into a perfect little wild

daffodil.
