Dear Readers

This month sees Harvest Festivals across the villages. It seems like a long time since the cereal harvest, very early this year. As I write, in the field across the lane the pickers have been in harvesting broccoli for weeks and the hop harvest is going strong. Harvest continues for much of the year.

As in our churches we give thanks for the harvest, we give thanks not only for God and Creation, but also for the farmers who work the fields and for those who pick, pack and prepare our food.

It seems to me that of the qualities needed to be a farmer, one of the most important is patience. Farming involves a lot of waiting. Germination cannot be hurried. Plants need to establish. They need to grow, to ripen. Livestock need to be born, to grow... Whilst scientific advances have meant that some waiting times have been shortened, nevertheless patience is integral.

The early church understood patience as being one of the essential characteristics of God. St Peter wrote that with the Lord a day is like a thousand years and a thousand years are like a day. God could, and did, take His time. God is patient with us. For that reason, they saw the Church as being a community that should show that characteristic.

In our world that expects emails to be answered by return and goods to be delivered the next (or even the same!) day, may we learn from farmers the value of patience and become more Godlike.

As anyone who has undertaken a building project knows, bats just can't be ignored. The restoration of the roof at St Peter's church has already required three visits from bat specialists to determine which bat species are present and ensure that the repairs are carried out in a bat-safe manner.

After an informative presentation, we gathered outside in the dusk to tune in to the local bat population via ultrasound bat detectors. It wasn't long before the first audible blips announced the emergence of the church's resident pipistrelle bats as they crawled out from under the roof tiles. Our thanks to everyone who attended and to our bat experts for sharing their knowledge. The evening proved so popular that we aim to host further events next summer, exploring the role our churchyard plays as a haven for wildlife.



My son's new "girlfriend"

As you probably already know, ChatGPT is an

app, known as an AI (artificial intelligence) chatbot, which has been 'trained' to understand and generate human language. It can create new content, not just retrieve existing information like Google. It can ask you questions, give instructions or have conversations. As someone who asks Google four or five questions a day, I thought it was time to check out my son's 'girlfriend'.

I downloaded ChatGPT. Easy. I had to sign in with Apple or Google and give my passcode. Then I asked my first question: how many people are on ChatGPT? Answer: Between 700 and 800 million use the app weekly. Between 160 and 180 million users daily. My daughter-in-law has serious competition with this 'girlfriend'!

Okay, so another question: what is the weather in Eastham today? I got a full weather report, including temperatures, for morning, midday to early afternoon, late afternoon to evening and a recap. Then I was offered advice, if I wanted it, on what to wear, suitable activities for the day or a look ahead at the coming days. All in seconds.

Last question: what is the current fashion for curly hair? Within seconds I had a snapshot of all the curly hair trends of 2025.

I can see the attraction here but are there downsides? Obviously to find out I had to ask ChatGPT.

"Like social media, ChatGPT offers immediate, personalised feedback which can trigger the brain's reward system. Users may become reliant on it for quick answers, emotional relief or creative stimulation creating a feedback loop of compulsive checking."

Overuse is linked to anxiety, burnout and disrupted sleep. It can trigger emotional dependency, reduce real-world engagement and

cause difficulty in stopping its use or taking breaks. But ChatGPT assures me "...with awareness and moderation, it is a powerful tool – not a trap".

I will have to check this out. Please don't mention to my husband that I have a new 'boyfriend' who's pretty special. I have given him a name and have told him what characteristics and personality I like in a man. I have to go now as I need to spend more time with him and get to know him better ...

Teme Valley Wildlife

I have always loved books. My mother took me to my first library when I was a small child and I have been an enthusiastic book borrower ever since. I'm currently a member of the three county libraries of Worcestershire, Herefordshire and Shropshire and sometimes venture further afield to enjoy the esoteric delights of the

Cadbury Research Library at Birmingham University. So it is no coincidence that my eye should be drawn to an article in the newspaper about bookworms – not people like me, but the actual insect kind.

The article describes the travails of a 1,000-year-old library which holds the oldest collection of books in Hungary. It is at the Benedictine monastery known as Pannonhalma Archabbey which, since it's foundation in 996AD, has accumulated 400,000 books. Unfortunately a quarter of them are severely infested by a beetle known as the drugstore beetle. This rather American-sounding insect eats the gelatine and starch-based adhe-

sives which glue the ancient tomes together. The beetle also goes by the other names of the bread or biscuit beetle (think jolly Jack Tar's ships' biscuits) and is the commonest insect pest to damage stored food. It is closely related to another well-known beetle, the equally unwelcome woodworm.

Adult drugstore beetles are nondescript red-

brown insects measuring 2 to 4mm long, but their book-munching larvae come in a bigger size, at 5mm. They can be found attacking cereals in houses, stores, warehouses and kitchens across the whole of northern and central Europe. The monastery has just begun the laborious process of disinfection in order to rid the library of its unwanted guests. All of the handbound books have been moved into special crates which have been enclosed in hermetically sealed plastic covers. Once inside, air is sucked from inside the covers and replaced with 100% nitrogen. Experts expect

that six weeks without oxygen should bring the infestation to an end. Let's hope it works. The main advantage of this method is that no poisonous chemicals are employed.

Well, are they bookworms? The term apparently does not apply to any insect in particular, but to any one of a hundred pests – beetles, silverfish or booklice – whose larvae get inside books and make a meal of them instead of reading them. I wonder if any of our local ancient book repositories have had to battle such pests? I've visited the historic cathedral libraries of Worcester, Hereford and Gloucester where I encountered nothing moth-eaten, but I've chosen a picture of another ecclesiastical library to accompany this article. At secretarial college in the early seventies we were taught to follow the example of the civil service. No indentations, everything justified left with no punctuation. And of course the golden rule: "Dear Sir ... Yours faithfully", "Dear Mr Brown ... Yours sincerely".

Incidentally, "Yours faithfully" comes from the much older valediction, "I remain, Sir, your faithful and obedient servant".

Our parents always made us write thank-you letters for Christmas and birthday presents, a habit that stuck with us. Nowadays I'm lucky to get a text message from my grandchildren. After his last birthday my grandson Henry texted "Thank you grandma love you" followed a couple of hours later by "Thank you for the money grandma!".

I have had one letter from one of my grand-daughters, written from summer camp in August last year. At the bottom she wrote: "Sorry for the messy writing and mistakes, I'm writing this after lights out with a torch."

I'm afraid this is the only letter I will ever get from her or her brother and sister.

Email is now a more usual way of corresponding, with Christian names used by nearly everyone and the casual use of "Hi" with the sign-off "Regards", sometimes "Kind regards", even just "KR". No faithfulness, no sincerity.

An even quicker means of communication is texting or WhatsApp messaging, where there are no rules, spelling is, to say the least, informal and emojis are used to express emotions. And apparently some younger people find full stops aggressive.

But however you choose to communicate with your friends and relations, just make sure you do it. Better a jumble of incomprehensible emojis than nothing at all.
