Dear Readers

I write this just after the death of former Italian Prime Minister Berlusconi. The BBC, reporting the death, referred to the rise of "populist politics". We have seen populist politics rise elsewhere with Boris Johnson and his resignation as an MP, Trump claiming the legal charges against him are "politically motivated" ... you can think of other examples from around the world.

What insights does Christianity have for our response? Three suggestions.

First in the bible we see a gradual realization that God is God not just of *one* nation but of *all* nations. Of course as citizens of Britain we have a concern and loyalty for this country. But we should remember that God is as concerned for Eswatini as for England and for Suriname as for Scotland. Any political leader that is looking for rewards for their own country rather than for all countries is not in step with God's priorities.

Second we see that God has always had a concern for people on the margins. From the Old Testament instructions to allow the less well off to glean at harvest, through Jesus' story of the rich man and the beggar, through the Church's history of providing food, shelter, healing, places of education to the food banks of today, Christianity has a long history of reflecting God's concern for the marginalized. Any political leader that is looking for the rich to get richer without including the poor is not in step with God's priorities.

Thirdly, as Christians we are called to pray for political leaders. That doesn't mean we have to agree with them but we have a responsibility to pray for them, that they may be in step with God's priorities and that they have the wisdom, courage and integrity to govern for the good of all.







utes to four. "The restaurant closes at 4.30," I said. "But last orders are at 4 o'clock," said the Boss who had read the notice. I asked a very young and slightly apprehensive-looking waitress if we could have a cream tea. She looked towards an older woman, who pointed to a jar of green tea bags.

"No, *cream* tea," I said. "Well, we've only got one cheese scone left, so not really." We left.

In Tenbury we parked outside the Spotty Dog but thought we'd try Mr Thom's first. Here the girl behind the counter said yes, we could have a cream tea but only if we had ordered it in advance. In advance? What about if you just happen to fancy a cream tea on a sunny afternoon? We left.

So we went to the Spotty Dog. "Cream tea? Yes, of course." And it was absolutely fabulous. We each had two enormous fruit scones, a big dish of glistening strawberry jam and a big dish of billowing cream. And a big pot of tea to share. Perfect – at last!

In her teens she became a resident at Kyre Park and became part of the community there and in the parish – she was skilled at selling raffle tickets, enjoyed riding for the disabled at Lower House farm, train days at The Hyde and more. She stitched kneelers for Kyre church, helped with the cleaning and attended services. After her move to Chantry

Close in Tenbury she continued her faith journey and was confirmed. Many in Tenbury remember her smiling face – and dodging her tricycle as she speeded on errands!

Holidays were often spent at Skylarks holiday home near Derby enjoying everything on offer, full of fun and laughter! As her health deteriorated she asked Peter Thornycroft to be her advocate and he ensured that whilst he did all the research into the choices and changes that occurred over the years — meaning that later she had to go back into residential care — it was always Karen who had the final say. At the funeral there were people from all the times of her life to wish her well and celebrate her life

Robert Bennett

Bob Bennett was born on 15th October 1937 and was nearing retirement when he moved to Kyre, having worked all his life as a civil engineer, one post being in Uganda. He was a great one for fixing things and finding solutions and a sure friend and supporter for his children.

Bob always enjoyed world travel and the adventure of being off the tourist trail. His other love was arranging music for concerts with friends both at home and at Kyre in support of the church roof fundraising in the early part of this century. For some years he played the small organ at


Kyre – which was certainly a workout for the knees as it had to be constantly pedalled for the notes to sound while playing a different rhythm with the fingers!

Teme Valley Wildlife

The National Gallery in London is currently hosting an exhibition which features paintings of St Francis of Assisi. The works on show include depictions by artists from medieval times, such as Botticelli, through to more modern artists such as Stanley Spenser. Of all the saints, Saint Francis is



the most closely associated with wild creatures and is famously said to have preached to a flock of birds, a subject shown in some of the paintings. He lived in Umbria in thirteenth-century Italy and was brought up to a life of luxury. He was the son of a wealthy silk merchant, but his father disowned him when Francis grew disillusioned with the ways of the world and renounced his inheritance.

Francis took vows of poverty and started the religious order named after him. He saw God reflected in nature and referred to all creatures as his brothers and sisters. He had a great love both for animals and for the environment. He is said to

have arranged a pact between the inhabitants of the town of Gubbio and a wolf who was preying on them. They promised to feed him in return for the cessation of his attacks. Francis was particularly impressed by the humble lark and thought that the little bird soared into the air with a burst of song in

order to praise God. He chose the dull brown colour of the lark's feathers as the colour for his followers' robes. Thus were the Franciscans distinguished from other orders of monks.

Earlier in the year, whilst on a circular walk between Nash, Coreley and Boraston, I was fortunate to see a large flock of larks rise up into the air as I entered a field. A few steps further, two hares took to their heels. They were both beautiful wildlife sights, although perhaps St Francis could have persuaded them to stay. The walk took place on a bright and sunny day in March and I like to imagine that the hares had been engaged in a sea-

St Francis composed a hymn called the Canticle of the Sun. He used it to thank God for brother sun, sister moon and brothers wind, water, fire and earth. Part of it runs, "Mother Earth who sustains us and governs us and who produces varies fruits with coloured flowers and herbs". Francis must be one of the earliest environmentalists and it is no surprise that he was a very popular saint and the subject of many portraits. Neither is it a surprise that "The Lark Ascending" by Ralph Vaughan Williams is regularly voted the nation's favourite piece of classical music by Classic FM listeners. I think that both St Francis and Vaughan Williams, in different ways, tapped very successfully into mankind's deeply ingrained love for nature.
