Dear Readers

The shortest day is almost upon us, the sun has been shining and the delights of spring are giving way to the expectation of summer to come.

I am writing on Rogation Day when traditionally we beat the bounds of our parish and ask for blessings on the land and all who work to produce our food. We give thanks for the fruits of creation in all its abundance. And these days we promise to do all in our power to cherish these precious gifts and leave our mother earth in good shape for future generations.

This year we celebrated Rogation at our Sunday afternoon Café Church up on the Broadheath. Rectory Lane is right on top of the Teme Valley world. We walked and talked and stopped to pray and sing our way from Hanley village hall, around the Rectory garden and back again. We scattered prayer and song over fields and farms, woodland and meadow, orchard and veg patch. Singing lifted us even beyond the highest point in the parish ...

Of all the things that happened in the month of May the surprise moment for me was the Eurovision Song contest. It wasn't top of my list and then I switched on just for the fun of it and I found it completely captivating, joyous and energetic. All these countries, each so different, singing their hearts out, for fun and friendship.

What is it about music which so much lifts the spirits? I loved looking after our TVS Nomadic Singers all those years ago. About a dozen of us wandered about the parish singing at each of our churches from time to time at Easter, say, or Mothering Sunday or Harvest. A motley crowd. As the years went by our numbers decreased. Our last engagement was for a wedding at Kyre. We had a farewell picnic by the lake.

There are still a few of us around and last Christmas we were delighted to sing in a scratch choir at Stanford under the leadership of Chloe Evans, a professional musician who grew up in

Louise Shakespeare

The village of Eastham was blessed to have Cliff and Louise Shakespeare amongst its residents. They moved here in 1972 and from then until Louise moved into Tenbury after Cliff's death, they made a huge contribution to village life.

They both loved living in the unspoilt beauty of the Teme valley at The Dingle on the Highwood, protected by beautiful trees and shrubs and with a wonderful view of the Clee Hills. A quiet and gentle couple, they enjoyed nature and embraced the countryside.

They saw above and beyond what many of us see through the eyes of their camera lenses and have left a wonderful legacy in their beautiful photograph albums. They took many of the photographs for Eastham's millennium book, *Eastham: Within Living Memory* capturing the essence of life in Eastham perfectly.

Louise was an only child, born to Doris and Arch Hunter in 1935 in Camberwell in the London borough of 'Suthick' (Southwark). In her teens Louise became a secretary in London and then decided to follow in her grandmother's footsteps and visit Canada. On the boat she met a handsome, dashing young man. They fell hopelessly in love and were married on board!

They explored Canada together and worked hard. Cliff was determined to make enough money to return to the UK, buy a home and open a mechanic's workshop. All of which he did at The Dingle.

Louise loved painting all her life; flowers were a particular favourite. She used to love visiting all the galleries in London, so perhaps it was a natural progression from painting to photography for

Louise. She and Cliff could be so funny about their work – both claiming to have taken a particular picture! They were madly competitive yet equally talented. Often I think Cliff was just winding her up!

Theirs was a rich and colourful life together. When Cliff died at The Dingle in 2011, Louise was understandably lost. Her health had started to decline further although she continued her long happy walks. She tried to live on her own but found it lonely. Although Cliff loved his cars, Louise had never learned to drive so she was isolated on the Highwood and moved to Cralves Mead in Tenbury. From here she continued her walks, made regular visits to The Spotty Dog café and frequently took the bus to Worcester or Ludlow to explore.

But she was still lonely. Eventually she just couldn't cope and moved into the Old Rectory in June 2017 where she became as loved by the staff as she was by everyone. They became like a family to her. She was always cheerful and grateful, and had that beautiful smile on her face and her infectious laugh – right up to the morning she died.

A friend who cared for Lou at the Old Rectory said that during the night Lou had told a nurse that soon she would be joining her dear husband. Then her face lit up and she said, "Ah, there he is!" Hours later she died peacefully in her sleep.

An era has ended in Eastham but we are all the richer for our own Shakespearean period.

Citizens Advice South Worcestershire

Getting a service put right

I've just had my bathroom retiled, but I'm not happy with the work.

At first, things seemed to be going well, but then the tradesperson left to do another job and I had to chase them for updates. They did eventually come back and finish the job, but the work was pretty rough around the edges. They also left all the old tiles and plaster for me to dispose of, which I wasn't expecting. I've now got the invoice, but I don't think the price reflects the the service I got. Can I challenge this?

It's always frustrating when you run into problems with home improvements.

You mention that the job looked "rough round the edges". If this is to a degree you could consider the job unfinished or unsafe, you should be able to get the tiler to come back to fix it. You could also suggest removing the old tiles might be considered as part of finishing the job.

If the tiler considers the work complete, it's worth knowing you're protected by the Consumer Rights Act 2015, which says the tiler should have completed the work with "reasonable care and skill". If they haven't done this, they've broken the law. The Act means you're legally entitled to ask the tiler to fix the problem (if they provided the

tiles as well as the service) or get money refunded (if they just provided the service and you bought the tiles). They should fix the problem or refund you in a reasonable amount of time, without causing too much inconvenience. As you've received the invoice for the work but not paid yet, now would be a good time to ask them to fix the issue or you can negotiate a lower price for the work.

Let the tiler know you understand what you're entitled to. Speak to them in person, or contact them in writing, there are template letters on the Citizens Advice website. Either way make sure you have a written copy of anything agreed. Before you contact them, it's a good idea to take photographs to use as evidence of the problem. Make notes about what happened, including dates and times. You should also gather any paperwork and receipts – was there any prior written agreement about who would dispose of the old tiles? Was the final cost in line with estimates or quotes given to you at the outset of the work. If not, there is advice on the Citizens Advice website about steps you can take.

Teme Valley Wildlife

I visited my local church for a service on Good Friday and was struck by the simple beauty of a branch of pussy willow placed in a plain vase in front of the porch window. The rest of the church was unadorned, waiting to be filled with the Easter flowers of resurrection.

Palm Sunday has traditionally been the day for pussy willow, more properly named goat willow or *Salix caprea*, to enter churches. Willow sprays were once used as a substitute for palms on Palm Sunday and some churchgoers wore willow sprigs in their lapels when attending services on that special day.

Goat willow is a plant of damp places and is the commonest and most widespread type of willow growing in the British Isles. The graceful silvery buds that we call pussy willows are soft and tactile and go on to develop into catkins. The buds appear in January and by March the male form opens into a cloud of yellow pollen. Whilst in this stage they have been dubbed "goslings" because



of their resemblance to newly hatched geese. The plant gained the name "Gosling-tree" in Wiltshire for this reason. Known elsewhere as the great willow or saugh-tree, in our local three counties it is more commonly referred to as the sally.

The tree comes in separate male and female forms. The buds open before the oval leaves, which have a pointed tip, hairy stalks and a grey-green colour. Their matt upper surface is darker than the silvery underside. Most willows are pollinated by the wind, but the pussy willow produces nectar to attract bees and flies. These insects aid the process and find the goat willow to be an important early source of both nectar and pollen. Later in the year and in the south of England, it acts as the food-plant for the caterpillars of the rare purple emperor butterfly.

Goat willow is a native tree and is known as a pioneer species – one which quickly colonises a

newly cleared area. Alongside birch and aspen, it was one of the first trees to grow in the tundra of Britain after the last ice age. It makes either a large shrub or a tree ten metres or so in height, and if cut down rapidly sends up new shoots. These can grow by two inches a day and can reach a height of 11 feet in the first season after felling. Goat willow wood makes good charcoal and was formerly valued by makers of gunpowder. However, it is not good as firewood because it crackles violently when burnt. It was used for wattle, part of the "wattle and daub" of latter-day house construction, and tannin and salicin, a source of aspirin, were once extracted from its bark.

Finally, where did the name goat willow come from? It apparently refers to its first known illustration, printed in a herbal by Hieronymus Bock in 1546. He gave a description of the plant and the

accompanying woodcut shows a small tree being grazed by a goat.
