Dear Readers

Some of you may have heard that due to financial constraints I have been asked to have priestly oversight of a further three parishes. These parishes are our near neighbours and include the churches of Shelsley Beauchamp, Shelsley Walsh, Clifton upon Teme, Harpley and the closed church at Lower Sapey. I will remain as priest in charge of the parish here in Teme Valley South, living in Hanley Rectory, so this is an additional responsibility.

Expanding my ministry is somewhat daunting and without doubt I will need to work differently. As I reflected about this, I thought back to the arrival of our second child. Each of our children is unique and loved individually. Welcoming a second child didn't diminish my feelings for the first. I found my heart expanding to love the two siblings because parental love isn't diluted when a new baby arrives. As Christians we believe love comes from God. This is an inexhaustible source, much like a spring that never runs dry even when there is no rain. Routines may change to encompass an expanded family however!

So when I am licensed as curate in charge of the new parishes on 22nd October in Clifton on Teme church, my prayer will be for an expanded heart. My five years here in Teme Valley South have been extraordinary, not least because of national events such as a pandemic, a 70th Jubilee, the death of our Queen and a coronation. There have been many changes in that time and I am sure the future will hold more. I am however confident, with the help of a gifted group of lay and ordained colleagues, that sharing God's love will continue to be the basis of all we do here and on the other side of the B4203 too!

Teme Valley Wildlife

September always seems a sober month. Warm, relaxing summer days fade from our minds as we turn to new challenges and more serious tasks, preparing for winter and laying up stores to get us through. Many animals are looking ahead too,

to a time of scarce food and harsh conditions, and many have busily gathered and cached food in preparation. One such is the red squirrel, which I had the pleasure of watching during the summer.

It is thought that only 30,000 or so breeding pairs remain in England today. They were once spread across the whole country, but are now restricted to specific small areas. They once lived here in the Teme valley, but an Eastham resident with an excellent

memory tells me that he hasn't seen one since 1938. It is well known that the diseases introduced by imported grey squirrels have heavily impacted our native populations. Fortunately, there are places where they can still be spotted.

Red squirrels do well in conifer plantations and in the north of England "red squirrel refuges" are managed at 17 different locations in an attempt

to give them the best possible conditions in which to thrive. The Yorkshire Dales town of Hawes is very proud of its local squirrel wood and provides a bus service to take visitors to Snaizeholme valley where a woodland trail leads to a viewing area at

which they may often be seen. I expected a fleeting glimpse of a bushy red tail disappearing up a tree as the most likely positive outcome to my visit, but I was entranced to see many squirrels in close-up, foraging, sprinting across the ground, running along branches, sitting on tree-stumps, perching on walls and scampering up trees. What a delight!

Red squirrels are about half the size of the more familiar greys. They sport tufty ears and a smart

reddish-brown coat and live in dreys, which are nests of twigs, leaves and moss. They have litters of three to four kittens, breeding between January and April, but can produce a second litter in a year in which food is plentiful. They don't hibernate over the winter. They favour seeds from pinecones as food, which is why coniferous forests provide

such good habitat for them. In pine woods they maintain an advantage over greys because, being lighter, they can reach cones which hang at the ends of branches. They also eat other seeds, a variety of nuts and berries and, perhaps surprisingly, are known to store fungi to snack on during the winter.

Other places where they can be seen include islands from which grey squirrels can readily be kept away. One such is Brownsea Island in Poole harbour, Dorset; another is Tresco, one of the Isles of Scilly. Our own native reds need a little help but they are holding on and, for such appealing creatures, such help will surely be forthcoming.
